With two new Artistic Advisors on our board, new partnerships, and a fresh look at composers you know and love next to others waiting to be heard, this is a season of discovery and exploration.

SAFE AND SOUND

While times are changing we want to assure you that we will be following the most up-todate COVID safety guidelines to help create a worry-free concert experience for you and us. These safety guidelines will adhere to the county and Mendocino College protocols. In addition to required masks and screening at the door before entering the building, we are implementing reserved, distanced seating for live audiences. There will be an extra intermission for longer concerts, and all four concerts will be available online for those who prefer to view from home.

FOR OUR SCHOOLS

We are developing a new *Symphony in the Schools* program - which, once it is safe to do so, will bring interactive performances and presentations by our musicians to schools and educational centers in and around Ukiah. This season, a streaming link to the family concert, along with educational materials, will be made available for free to all area classrooms.

We believe music has the power to unite and serve as a model for greater communication, cultural understanding, and commitment to one's community. Music education is at the core of what the Ukiah Symphony does to foster the future of classical music for everyone.

CONCERT TALKS

One hour before most of our concerts, Music Director Phillip Lenberg shares an inside look at the music performed by the symphony. You may even meet some of the symphony's guest artists and musicians!

The Ukiah Symphony has also partnered with Symphony of the Redwoods to create the *Up Close and Classical* podcast series. All episodes are available for free on our website.

Phillip Lenberg *Music Director*

Phillip serves as Music Director of the Ukiah Symphony Orchestra, and Professor of Music at Mendocino College. He was the Assistant Conductor of the Las Vegas Philharmonic and the Henderson Symphony Orchestra from 2007–2011, as well as the assistant conductor of orchestras, opera productions, and part-time conducting teacher at the University of Nevada at Las Vegas.



There he worked as the assistant conductor for Itzhak Perlman, as well as the rehearsal and cover conductor for concerts featuring Hilary Hanh, Sarah Chang, The Manhattan Transfer, and many other internationally renowned artists.

A sought-after pedagogue, Phillip has been invited to conduct at San Francisco State University, San Francisco Conservatory of Music, Sonoma State University, California State University in Fullerton, University of Nevada in Las Vegas, and more. For four years Phillip was the Music Director at French American International School in San Francisco, CA, and has taught at San Francisco State University, Woodside International School, and the University of Nevada.

As an avid proponent of contemporary music, Phillip has premiered many new works from emerging composers, and has worked with internationally acclaimed composers including Chen Yi, Gabriela Lena Frank, Virko Baley, Bernard Rands, Ian Krouse, and Daria Semegen. Phillip served as the Resident Conductor for the Nextet New Music Ensemble from 2007–2010, and for the Oakland Composers' Collective from 2012–2015. As a composer, Phillip's music has been performed by Da Capo Chamber Ensemble, Left Coast Chamber Ensemble, the California Orchestra Director's Association, and has been featured at film festivals including Sundance International Film Festival and CineVegas Short Films Festival.

Phillip holds both Master's and Doctoral degrees in orchestral conducting from the University of Nevada in Las Vegas, where he received a Most Outstanding Graduate Student award. As an instrumentalist, he has performed at Notre Dame Cathedral, The Glenn Gould Studio of the CBC, Herbst Theater, Nourse Theater, and SF Jazz. He has participated in festivals including Atlantic Music Festival, Nextet New Music Festival, and worked as an assistant at The Conductors Retreat at Medomak. Phillip pursued his bachelor's degree at the Glenn Gould School of the Royal Conservatory of Music, and SUNY Stony Brook where he studied classical guitar and composition.

Margie Salcedo Rice Concertmaster & Assistant Conductor

Margie is beginning her 37th season with the Ukiah Symphony. She began violin lessons at age seven and later studied with Claire Hodgkins, former assistant to world-renowned violinist, Jascha Heifetz. She has played with the Riverside Symphony, Santa Rosa Symphony, Guayaquil Symphony, and later became Concertmaster of the Loma Linda University Orchestra where she received her degrees in business administration and music, graduating magna cum laude.

In 2008 she performed the Mozart Symphony Concertante with Keith Lawrence, violist. Her past musical accomplishments have included performances as featured soloist of the Bruch Violin Concerto and Mozart G Major Concerto. In 2005, she and her students debuted at Carnegie Hall and in 2006 at Kennedy Center. Margie has been teaching violin for more than 30 years and currently conducts the Ukiah Junior Academy Orchestra, K-6 Choirs and Ukiah Junior Academy Chorale. She has served as Choral Director and Minister of Music for the Ukiah Seventh-Day Adventist Church conducting the annual "Christmas Cantata -The Glory of Christmas," now in its 30th season.

Margie recently became a California licensed attorney working for Carter Rich PC specializing in estate planning, real property, and general civil litigation.

In addition to playing the violin, Margie is an accomplished vocalist. She was a featured soloist in "Broadway Under the Stars" in 2011. She has appeared as "Beauty" in the Ukiah Symphony's production of Beauty and the Beast and "Broadway Under the Stars" with Jarrod McNaughton. She completed her third album, "In Your Holiness," released in April of 2010 and has two albums, "Carry Me On" and "By My Side" with the Salcedo Sisters. She is featured regularly on Three Angels Broadcasting Television Network and performs Christian Contemporary concerts across the country.

Margie resides in Ukiah with her husband, Dr. Geoffrey Rice, Ophthalmologist. She has three musical daughters, Jessica (violinist), Patricia (violinist) and Elizabeth (cellist) and three grandsons. Daniel, Giovanni, and William.

Melinda Martinez Becker's New Mexican and Jewish heritage has shaped her career as a performer of art song in Spanish, Ladino, and Yiddish and a variety of other languages. As a soloist and chamber musician, she is recognized for her expressive interpretations of diverse repertoire, such as baroque, new, and experimental music: "Throughout the program, mezzo-soprano Becker effortlessly switched tracks, from light Baroque singing to all the various demands of the new works". (San Francisco Classical Voice)

Melinda's collaborations with emerging new music composers and ensembles include projects with Nicolas Benavides, Brian Baumbusch and the Lightbulb Ensemble, Emily Koh, George Hurd, Helia Music Collective, the Musical Art Quintet, and as a soloist with the Classical Revolution Orchestra and the Ukiah Symphony Orchestra. Through her passion for chamber music, she is a founding member of Renegade Duo with guitarist Jon Mendle, a collaboration dedicated to performing uncommon and rarely heard repertoire for guitar and voice. Melinda earned her Masters of Music in Vocal Performance at the San Francisco Conservatory of Music studying with Catherine Cook. Through Project Canción Española at the Escuela Superior de Canto in Madrid, and Música en Compostela in Santiago de Compostela, Spain, she studied Spanish chamber music and art song, as well as pursued post-graduate studies at the Conservatoire de Strasbourg in France. Melinda is on the music faculty at Dominican University of California.


